

SNOWMAN SCAVENGER HUNT

BUILD A FAMILY SNOWMAN

AND

SNOWMAN RIDDLE WORD SCRAMBLE

You will need:

- * Pencil
- * Clue Sheet
- * Our Family Snowman Sheet
(or a blank piece of paper)

Optional:

- * Dice
- * Clipboard
- * Snowman Riddles Sheet



Instructions:

1. Gather your family together and choose one member to draw the snowman body on the "Our Family Snowman" sheet or a blank piece of paper. Roll the dice and draw the corresponding body type indicated by the chart to the right. If you don't have a dice, have one family member call out a number between one and six. Be sure to draw the body large enough so that that other parts can be added throughout the rest of the Scavenger Hunt. You will also need a bit of room on one side of the snowman for an accessory.
2. Solve each clue on the "Clue Sheet" and go to the described location. All locations are found within the Town of Redwater. Clues will be out by 10:00am Monday, February 15. If you need a map of Redwater, go to www.redwater.ca and click *Maps* under the *Living* tab.
3. Before you get out of your vehicle at each location, roll your dice or have a family member choose a number between one and six. Remember this number as you get out of your car and go to the Scavenger Hunt poster. Take your pencil and paper with you.
4. Write down the word scramble letter in the box beside your clue.
5. Have one family member draw the snowman part according to the snowman drawing instructions found on the poster.
6. Once you have visited all the locations, unscramble the letters to solve the snowman riddle at the bottom of the "Our Snowman Family" sheet.
7. If you would like, post a picture of your family and/or your family snowman in the comments section of the Snowman Scavenger Hunt Facebook post found on the Town of Redwater page. *Please note: By posting your picture and any comments, you acknowledge that the Town of Redwater cannot control or prevent the further distribution or use of the material by those who access the information.*
8. Submit your entry by midnight to be put into a random draw for prizes. Send a picture of your completed form by text to 780-777-5051, by email to cscordinator@redwater.ca, or drop off your form in the red drop box at Pembina Place arena doors (4944-53 Street). Have fun!

CLUES

All locations are found within the Town of Redwater. If you need a map, go to www.redwater.ca and click Maps under the Living tab.

You would use the following at this outdoor location:



This round, red-roofed structure provides shade from the sun, shelter from the rain, and a place to sit while watching the traffic drive by on the highway going through Redwater.

Many young trees have been planted here over the last number of years in effort to create a more beautiful town and educate residents on varieties of trees. Look for a young aspen that's labelled with a synonym for "shaking" and you'll find your next station.

In the summer, you would pitch or park these here:



Look way, way up to the tallest point in town. Under the shelter near its base, you can find out what year Redwater started booming as a town—and you'll also find a word scramble letter and your next snowman-building instructions.

One section of our walking trail system leads you through a tree-lined path. In the summer, you may hear an occasional "Fore!" or golf strike to the south. (HINT: the word scramble letter and snowman-building instructions are found on the EAST end of this trail section.)

If you like to pretend to be a fish, whale or mermaid, you'd enjoy spending time at this place in the summer.

All aboard! This end-of-the-train car is rarely used on rail lines anymore, but the Town of Redwater has preserved a piece of history by showcasing this one in a park.
